My daughter Rachel and I had fun shopping to pick out a backpack we could add to the pile. 

In September, the children will receive a new calendar for the next 12 months to remind them what to bring each month. Please help your child to remember to bring this important offering for our food pantry ministry.

## Habitat for Humanity

Our Mission: *Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Newburgh brings people together to build homes, communities, and hope.*



Habitat for Humanity of Greater Newburgh has completed 85 houses since the founding of the affiliate in October 1999. Another six houses are currently under construction. As of January 2017, 457 people have been served, including 275 children. Also, Habitat Newburgh homes have increased the assessed property values in the city of Newburgh by approximately \$8.5 million and Habitat homeowners contribute approximately \$425,000 in city and school taxes annually.

Habitat serves low-income working families (30-60% area median incomes). Families are selected based on three criteria: **Need** (presently live in substandard conditions, **Ability to Pay** affordable mortgage plus school and city taxes, and **Willingness to Invest Sweat Equity** (500 hours for a 2+ adult family, 250 hours for a single adult family).

We build within the most distressed urban area in New York and also within the largest contiguous historic neighborhood in the state (includes Washington's Headquarters). Within our area (Census tracts 4 & 5), 40% of children under 18 live in poverty and the crime rate per capita is the highest in New York. There are approximately 700 vacant and abandoned properties in Newburgh.

Our average development cost per house is \$200,000, and the average homeowner's mortgage is \$100,000. The difference is made up through donations, grants, volunteer labor, and proceeds from our ReStore. Our ReStore (located at 38 S. Plank Rd, Exit 8 off of I-84) accepts donations of furniture, appliances, building supplies, home décor items, etc. Please call (845) 565-1789 Wednesday – Saturday to arrange for drop-offs and pick-ups of large items.

**The CNS Pre-K Program** is Gilead's nonsectarian school for 2 1/2 to 5 year olds. Since it was founded in 1949, the Pre-School has been a respected community resource for early childhood education. Our staff consists of three teachers and an aide with many years of experience at CNS between them. All are active members of the community and volunteers in the school district.

The school offers two, three and five day programs. They follow the same calendar as the Carmel Central School district.


In preparing a child for Kindergarten, their philosophy is teaching the whole child to grow. They provide a daily routine balanced between academic skills and lessons, crafts, free and structured play time, music, story time, computer time, snack, and outdoor activities on the large playground.

The curriculum was developed in conjunction with the area kindergarten teachers to best prepare the child for kindergarten and instill an enthusiasm for learning in a fun loving environment. Utilizing the team teaching method, three teachers give a student to teacher ratio of approximately 8 to 1.

For children scheduled to enter public school in September of the year, we routinely prepare a detailed evaluation of Kindergarten readiness.


