SCRIPTURE READING

Genesis 32:22-32

²² In the course of the night, Jacob arose and took his family and his entire caravan, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok River. ²³ After Jacob had crossed with all his possessions, he returned to the camp, ²⁴ and was completely alone; and there, someone wrestled with him until daybreak. ²⁵ Seeing that Jacob could not be overpowered, the other struck Jacob at the hip, and the hip was dislocated as they wrestled. ²⁶ Then Jacob's contender said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go until you bless me." ²⁷ "What is your name?" the other asked. "Jacob," he answered. 28 Then the other said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel—'Overcomer of God'—for you have wrestled with both God and mortals, and you have prevailed." ²⁹ Then Jacob asked, "Please tell me your name." But the other said, "Why do you ask me my name?" And blessed Jacob there. 30 So Jacob named the place Peniel-"Face of God"-"because I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved." 31 The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of the injured hip. 32 Therefore to this day the Israelites do not eat the thigh muscle that is on the hip socket, because Jacob was struck on the hip socket at the thigh muscle.

SCRIPTURE READING

1 Peter 2:4-9

Come to Christ, a living stone, rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵ like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual structure, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For it stands in scripture:

- "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in it will not be put to shame."
- ⁷ The stone is precious for you who have faith; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very cornerstone,"
