Ephesians 1:15-23

¹⁵ I have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶ I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷ I pray that the God of our Savior Jesus Christ, the God of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know the Creator, ¹⁸ so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which God has called you, what are the riches of God's glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹ and what is the immeasurable greatness of the power of God for us who believe, according to the working of this great power. ²⁰ God put this power to work in raising Christ from the dead and seating Christ at God's right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹ far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²² And God has put all things under Christ's feet and has made Christ the head over all things for the church, ²³ and the church is Christ's body, the fullness of the One who fills all in all.

SCRIPTURE READING

Matthew 25:31-46

³¹ "At the appointed time the Promised One will come in glory, escorted by all the angels of heaven, and will sit upon the royal throne, ³² with all the nations assembled below. Then the Promised One will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, ³³ and the sheep will be placed at the right hand, and the goats at the left hand. ³⁴ Then the ruler will say to those at the right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Abba God, inherit the heavenly realm prepared for you from the foundation of the world; ³⁵ for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶ I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' ³⁷ Then the righteous will answer, 'When was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? ³⁸ And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? ³⁹ And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' ⁴⁰ And the ruler will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did

it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' ⁴¹ Then the ruler will say to those at the left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and the fallen angels; ⁴² for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, ⁴³ I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' ⁴⁴ Then they also will answer, 'But when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' ⁴⁵ Then the ruler will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' ⁴⁶ And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."
