²⁵ Now large crowds were traveling with Jesus; and he turned and said to them, ²⁶ "Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ For which person, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether they have enough to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when they have laid a foundation and are not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule them, ³⁰ saying, 'They began to build and were not able to finish.' ³¹ Or what ruler, going out to wage war against another ruler, will not sit down first and consider whether they are able with ten thousand to oppose those who come to fight with twenty thousand? ³² If the ruler cannot, then, while the other is still far away, that first ruler sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. ³³ So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.


