SCRIPTURE READINGS

^{35a} On that day, when evening had come, ³⁷ a great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped.³⁸ But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" ³⁹ He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. ⁴⁰ He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" ⁴¹ And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" *Mark 4:35a, 37-41*

^{1a} Now the Philistines gathered their armies for battle; ⁴ And there came out from the camp of the Philistines a champion named Goliath, whose height was six cubits and a span. ⁵ He had a helmet of bronze, and he was armed with a coat of mail; the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of bronze. ⁶ He had a javelin slung between his shoulders. ⁷ His spear was like a weaver's beam, and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron.⁸ He stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel, "Choose a man for yourselves, and let him come down.⁹ If he is able to fight and kill me, then we will be your servants; but if I prevail against him, then you shall serve us. Today I defy the ranks of Israel!" ¹¹ When Saul and all Israel heard these words of the Philistine, they were greatly afraid. ²⁰ David came to the encampment as the army was going forth. ²¹ Israel and the Philistines drew up for battle, army against army.²² David ran to the ranks, and greeted his brothers.²³ As he talked with them, Goliath came up out of the ranks of the Philistines and spoke the same words as before. And David heard him. ³² David said to Saul, "Let no one's heart fail because of him; your servant will go and fight with this Philistine." ³³Saul said to David, "You are not able to go against this Philistine; for you are just a boy, and he has been a warrior from his youth." ³⁴But David said to Saul, "Your servant used to keep sheep for his father; and whenever a lion or a bear came, and took a lamb from the flock, ³⁵ I went after it and struck it down; and if it turned against me, I would catch it by the jaw, and kill it. ³⁶ Your servant has killed both lions and bears; and this Philistine shall be like one of them since he has defied the armies of the living God. The LORD, who saved me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, will save me from the hand of this Philistine." So Saul said to David, "Go, and may the LORD be with you!" ³⁸Saul clothed David with his armor; he put a bronze helmet on his head and clothed him with a coat of mail. ³⁹David strapped Saul's sword over the armor, and he tried in vain to walk. Then David said to Saul, "I cannot walk with these; for I am not used to them." So David removed them. ⁴⁰Then he took his staff in his hand, and chose five smooth stones and put them in his shepherd's bag, and he drew near to the Philistine. ⁴² When the Philistine saw David, he disdained him, for he was only a

youth. ⁴³The Philistine said "Am I a dog, that you come to me with sticks?" ⁴⁵But David said to the Philistine, "You come to me with sword and spear and javelin; but I come to you in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. ⁴⁶This very day the LORD will deliver you into my hand, and I will strike you down and cut off your head; and I will give the dead bodies of the Philistine army to the birds of the air and to the wild animals of the earth, ⁴⁷ so that all this assembly may know that the LORD does not save by sword and spear; for the battle is the LORD's and he will give you into our hand." ⁴⁸ When the Philistine drew nearer to meet David, David put his hand in his bag, took out a stone, slung it, and struck the Philistine on his forehead; the stone sank into his forehead, and he fell face down on the ground.
